

Christmas stamps now available. Father Christmas can be contacted by post...Father Christmas. Santa's Grotto. Reindeerland. XM45 HQ. October 2022 will see the end of use for the old £50 and £20 notes. From

1st October 2022 these notes will be classified as "outmoded". They will no longer be used in shops etc, but can be deposited into bank accounts for a further 20 years.

News from the Post Office concerning Post Office Card Account. (POCA) This is of interest to those that cannot have access to a regular bank account. The termination of POCA has been delayed by a year and will now finally take place in November 2022. Dept of Work and Pensions (DWP) will replace the card with a payment voucher service which will be issued either on a card, a text or email attachment and will be operational by August 2022.

• We offer all main PO postal & basic banking services, plus phone and energy meter top-ups, fishing licences, Moneygram, Health Lottery etc.,

• EU parcels need a correctly completed customs label.

• Foreign Currencies. We stock Euros and US dollars and can order other currencies, as you plan your trip abroad. POL have informed us that credit on Travel Money Cards can be encashed at all branches in UK currency

• The Post Office gift card can be used at pretty much every major retailer in the UK and online.

> Your Post Office offers free cash withdrawals with most debit cards, pay bills, top up gas and electricity cards and keys, pay in cheques and cash to most banks using your debit card.



Yalding School News

Enrichment Afternoon

After many months being unable to mix our first Enrichment Afternoon was a great success. This involved each House (from Year 1-Year 6) getting together for the afternoon to enjoy different activities. It was wonderful to have pupils from different age groups working together.

Activities included team games; mental health and well being activities - including drawing doodle monsters; story telling - including mask making and computer animation; stop motion photography.



Peer Mediation

Year 6 had training from Mrs McInnes from Maidstone Mediation. This will enable them to help younger children to solve any playground disagreements. They held an assembly to show the rest of the school how the mediation works and explained how it might help.

Enriching the Curriculum

Year 5 visited Maidstone Museum to enhance their learning for their Ancient Greece project. They took part in a workshop and examined many artefacts. They had a look around the museum before finishing off with some sketching in Whatman Park. Also, as part of their project. they also had a food tasting afternoon. They used all of their senses to analyse the items and taste foods such as olives, dips, flat breads, feta cheese and Greek yoghurt.

Year 4 took their learning outside after they had designed and made Roman army shields. They explored the different battle formations and how the shields protected the soldiers from being attacked and helped them attack their enemies more safely.
Year 3 went out into the village to carry out a traffic survey. They used their Geography and Maths skills as they stood outside the library to collect data about the number of cars that cross the bridge to use back in class.

Year 2 had to investigate after returning from Worship to discover the room in a mess. The children found several unusual items - including a basket, paw prints and a red cloak. Who could have been in the classroom?



The Travelling Book Fair visited Yalding and the pupils really enjoyed paired reading with the older children sharing books with the younger children.

Thank you to the PTA who helped after school to enable our keen readers to buy new books.


Thank you to all the parents and our usual village heroes for making it a huge success.

EXTRACTS FROM RECENT PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

PLAYSCHEME 2022

There will be a summer playscheme in Yalding but the venue is yet to be decided.

POLICE MATTERS

The Chairman attended the first Cluster Meeting between Police, Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) Community Safety Officer, MBC Ward Members and Nettlestead, Yalding, Collier Street, Marden, Staplehurst, Headcorn, Ulcombe and Boughton Malherbe Parish Councils. Items discussed:

- River problems particularly at Hampstead Lock Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)s and Community Safety officers are doing regular patrols. CCTV has been erected.
- Parent parking at schools- Inspector Kent said it was impossible for police to attend as he did not have enough officers. Some schools have setup School Wardens made up of both teachers and children. He would ask the Schools Officer to attend where there is a particular safety issue.
- Inspector Kent asked that residents be dissuaded from using Facebook to report crime, Twitter is best but there is a new app coming out to make it very easy to report any issue.
- Speedwatch Inspector Kent advised that he could arrange for an officer to attend speedwatch sessions from time to time.

PCSO Nicola Morris is back on reduced hours but office based for the time being.

YALDING ENTERPRISE PARK (YEP)

The S106 agreement has been signed and the outline planning permission has been received by YEP. The "For Sale/To Let" boards have been erected.

MAIDSTONE BOROUGH LOCAL PLAN REVIEW CONSULTATION 29 OCTOBER TO 12 DECEMBER 2021

The Regulation 19 consultation was launched on 29th October for 6 weeks. The documentation differs from the Regulation 18b in respect of Hallam owned land on Kenward Road, although still 100 homes in total, now has a reference to land to the south which includes homes, recreation and car parking. It was agreed to instruct Steve Clarke, our planning consultant, to prepare a response on our behalf to the Planning Inspectorate, to be circulated via Parish News in sufficient time for residents to respond to the consultation individually.

JUBILEE FIELD

The installation of new goal posts is complete.

THE TATT

The land registry extract now shows that YPC holds the title absolute.

Medway Valley Countryside Partnership (MVCP) has prepared a report on the use of this area, which has been circulated to all councillors. A site meeting is to be arranged to discuss this plan along with the condition of the road surface.

THE KINTONS

TRANSFER OF WOODS AND TRACK FROM COUNTRYSIDE

Still awaiting completion of the paperwork.

KG has cleared a small area of debris, fallen trees, unsafe undergrowth and has found a lot of glass, which he wants to bury, and would like to level it before a site meeting, when the MVCP management plan will be discussed.

A new play equipment supplier is being sought as after-sales service from Sovereign, the Jubilee Field supplier, has been appalling,

20'S PLENTY CAMPAIGN TO REDUCE 30PMH TO 20MPH

It was agreed to invite Adrian Berendt to present at the December Parish Council meeting.

If Councillors wish to take this forward, it will need to go into the Highways Improvement Plan otherwise KCC will not look at it. Adrian Berendt is attending the next Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC) meeting on 29th November with a live presentation.

HIGHWAYS IMPROVEMENT PLAN

This will be prepared by The Chairman and The Clerk. It was agreed to include the following in the first draft:

- •Return Town Bridge to a toll bridge
- Interactive signs at entrances to Yalding Village. Regrettably Laddingford has too much on-street parking.
- ANPR Speed Signs
- Double yellow lines outside Blumer Lock
- Move the 30mph out further along Benover Road
- Parking on Vicarage Road
- •Improvements to Hampstead Lane Junction

OTHER HIGHWAY ISSUES

KCC have undertaken a lot of work to clear all the gullies, to raise the ironwork to the level of the carriageway and to resurface West Street.

The Chairman has chased The Highways Engineer about the cobbles at Kingsland Cottages and the water on Vicarage Road that is running onto the track.

FLOODING

GENERAL UPDATE

Helen Grant will write to the Minister regarding the 42 properties with no protection, The Chairman will provide her with information. The Chairman is also updating the Emergency Plan but not just for fluvial flooding. A flood warden meeting is needed.

SUBSTATION at LYNGS FARMHOUSE

Helen Grant has agreed to write again to UKPN asking what is happening and why it cannot go on a pole. Also, why they have not sent the parish the addresses of the properties connected to it for survey.

From The Environment Agency newsletter Autumn 2021 An edited update on the progress of the Leigh Expansion Scheme

Leigh Flood Storage Area works

At the end of September 2021, after a public enquiry into objections, the Secretary of Sate **approved** the Environment Agency (EA) scheme to raise the Leigh Flood Storage Area (FSA) from 28.05m AOD to 28.6m AOD. The scheme proposed for Tonbridge and Hildenborough can now proceed.

We expect to appoint contractors for the scheme in spring 2022 with works programmed to begin at the FSA in summer 2022. The full scheme is due to be complete in autumn 2024, one year later than the original schedule.

Over the summer (2021), the Environment Agency has been carrying out essential works on the Leigh FSA which are required under the Reservoirs Act 1975. The works to the embankment will be ongoing over the next three years and will not affect the operation of the Leigh FSA to reduce the risk of flooding.

The works involve lifting the top soil of the existing main embankment, laying reinforcing materials & relaying soil and seeding grass. Once these works are complete, the embankments will look very similar to how they look now.

We know that residents have questions about the embankment so we will be holding a virtual engagement event in November where we'll provide an update on the proposals, show indicative landscape visualisations and answer any questions you have about the works.
